Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

Further to the continuous spreading of COVID -19 across India, it has resulted in restriction on physical visit to the client locations and the need for carrying out alternative audit procedures as per the Standards on Auditing prescribed by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI).

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

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1 CORPORATE INFORMATION

2 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

a. <u>BASIS OF ACCOUNTING:</u>

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Generally Accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) to comply with the Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 (as amended) and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 1956 (to the Extent applicable) and Companies Act, 2013 (to the Extent notified). Cash flows are reported using the indirect method, whereby profit/(loss) before extraordinary items and tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of non-cash nature and any deferrals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the Company are segregated based on the available information.

d. REVENUE RECOGNITION:

Income from operation:

The Company is following "Percentage of completion method" of Accounting. As per this method revenue from sale of properties is recognised in Statement of Profit & Loss in proportion to the actual cost incurred as against the estimated cost of project under execution with the group of transfer of significant risk and rewards to the buyer.

Income from Other Sources

Other Incomes include Interest income, etc.

e. <u>EARNINGS PER SHARE (EPS):</u>

Basic EPS

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax (including the post tax effect of extraordinary items, if any) by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

f. TAXES ON INCOME:

Current tax

Current tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the year as determined in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

g. PROVISIONS AND CONTIGENCIES:

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made.
